### **NAACP RESOLVES DISPUTE WITH WELLS FARGO OVER LENDING PRACTICES**

In its coverage of NAACP's law suit against U.S. banks over discriminatory lending practices, the National Law Journal on April 9 quoted Brian Kabateck, who represents the nonprofit. The latest news stemmed from the NAACP's decision to drop its lawsuit against Wells Fargo, which has agreed to comply with the NAACP's principles in fair lending practices.

"Wells Fargo is the first bank ever, to my knowledge, to adopt the NAACP's Banking Principles on Fairness and Lending," Kabateck said. "This sends a message to the other banks that haven't been willing to sit down with the NCAAP and come up with solutions."
