## **KNOW THE RULES FOR TECHNOLOGY-BASED EVIDENCE**

Richard Kellner and Michael Storti wrote an article entitled "Know the Rules for Technology-based Evidence," that was published in the May 10, 2010, issue of The Recorder, as the part of that publication's yearly Technology in Litigation supplement. The article explores the numerous upsides to using technology to present evidence, but it also warns that litigators should obtain rulings on admissibility before their trials are underway. While technology is an indispensable weapon in litigation, it is important to understand the evidentiary hurdles, according to Kellner and Storti. "In all circumstances, when there is any doubt regarding the admissibility of the evidence, the litigator should obtain a pre-ruling from the court regarding the admissibility of the demonstrative evidence," Kellner and Storti note.
